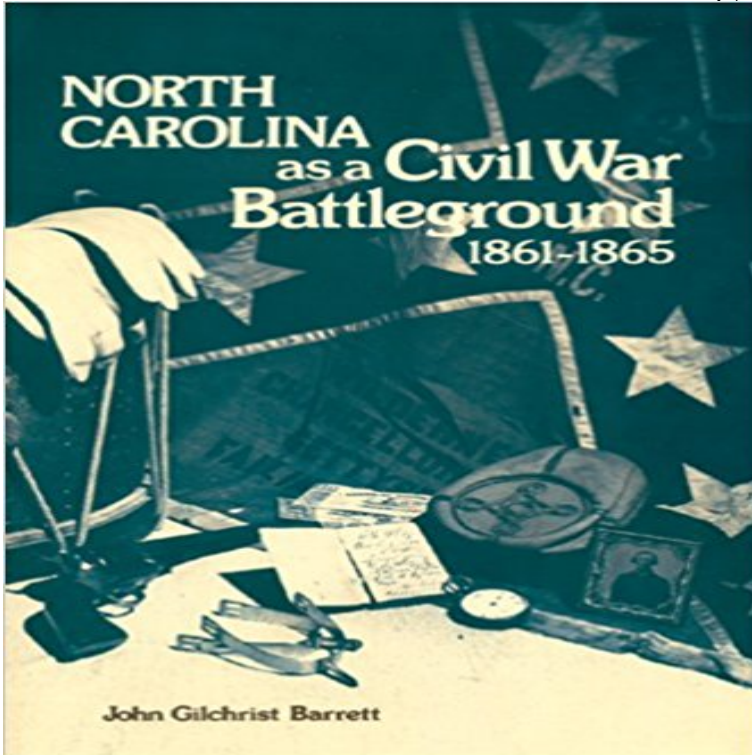


North Carolina as a Civil War Battleground, 1861-1865
