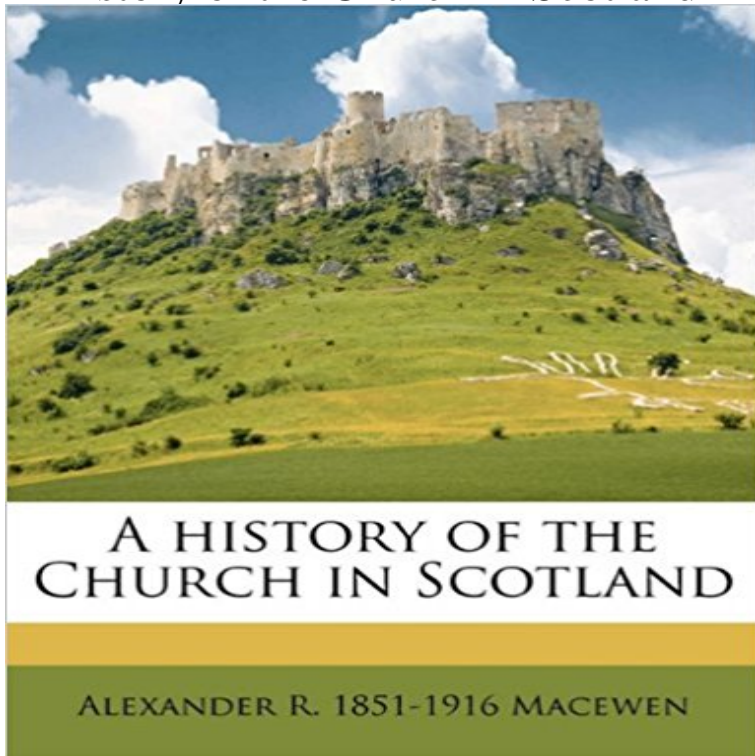


## A history of the Church in Scotland
